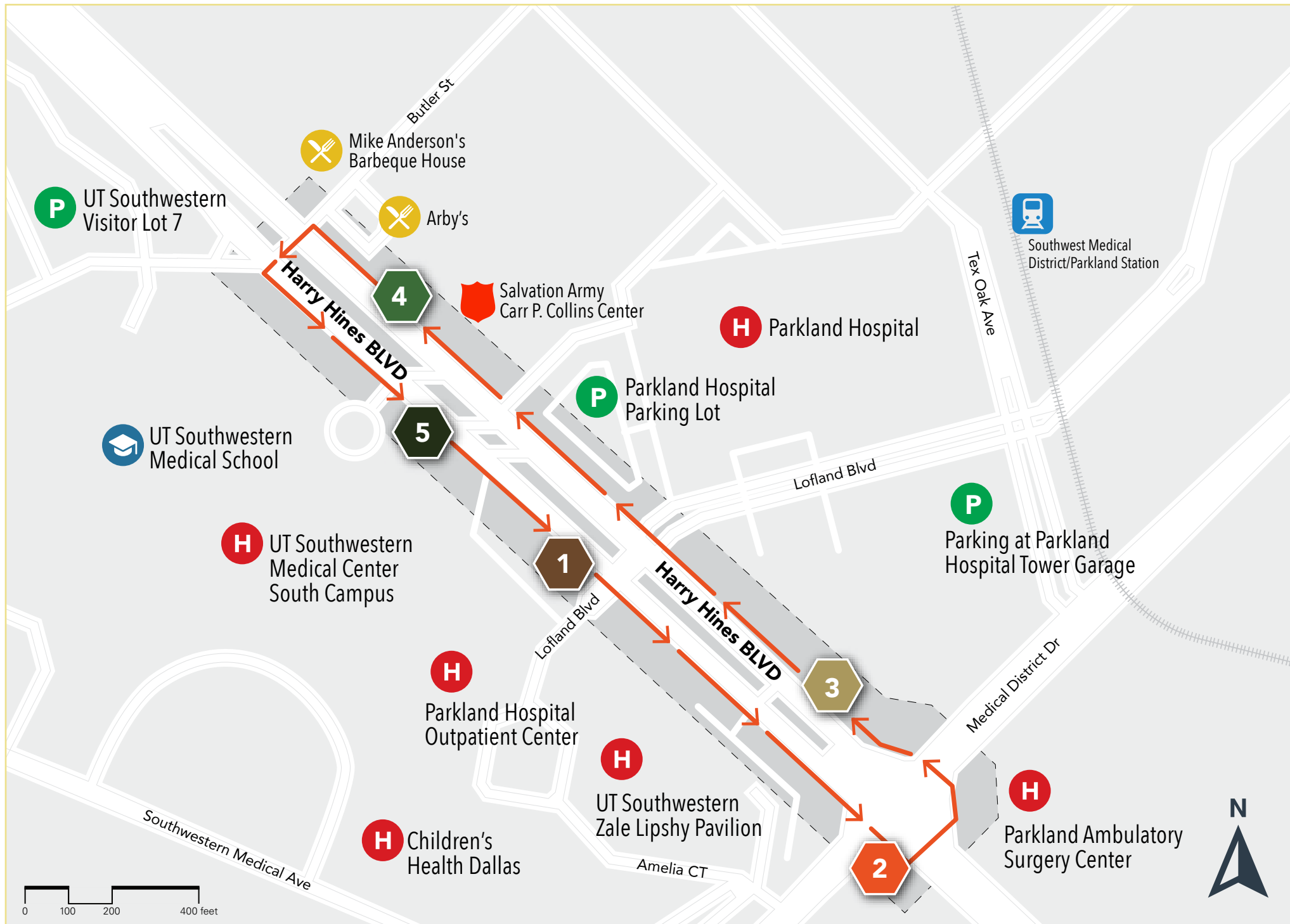


WALKING TOUR ROUTE


Using the Tour Guidebook
